Speed Camera...

The application for funding to fit two speed awareness cameras has been successful and due to be installed at the end of this month.

Meanwhile the police camera van continues to attend regularly.

30mph limit to be extended...

Permission has been granted to extend the 30mph speed limit out of the village towards Strubby, and awaits implementation.

Bus passengers have complained that the seat at the bus stop adjacent to the old post office is in a poor state of repair. Councillors are looking into the cost of having it renovated.

Travis Hesketh agreed to help villagers lobby to re-establish a more joined up bus service in the locality that will allow better access to the rest of the county, now the new Mayor's responsibility.

Geological Disposal Facility (GDF)

After the disclosure that hundreds of acres of land between Gayton Le Marsh and Great Carlton were being considered as the site of a future GDF, East Lindsey DC withdrew from the process and the then Conservative controlled County Council announced their intention to withdraw also. This issue remains unresolved and it is now the Reform UK led Councils decision to make. There is now confidence that this scheme will not proceed.

Pylons Lincolnshire

Further pylons for South Lincolnshire were announced on 13th May along with the news that Greenlink EGL3 & 4 will be routed along the seabed from wind farms in Scotland to come ashore at Anderby Creek along with the EGL5 link in the North Sea. All three will then run underground with power from EGL5 being connected to a new converter station at either Bilsby or Huttoft. The earlier proposal of a second converter and switching station at Bilsby will not be pursued.
