Parish Council News...

District Councillor Travis Hesketh spoke to the Parish Council about the proposed Local Government reform. There are four proposals being considered, with in his opinion, two viable options. The first being that the whole of Lincolnshire would be one authority, dispensing with the four District Councils. The second would divide the county into two, with approximately 500,000 people in each unitary council, meaning more councillors and more accountability locally. The third would include the north, north east of the county and Lincoln City and the fourth would be divided into four, but different to today.

He also spoke about the seeming inevitability of the building of the **Pylons and Substations** in the county in the coming years and urged affected parishes to take advantage of monies which will be available to spend on projects needed which would be otherwise unaffordable. A long wished for foot/cycle path to Mablethorpe along the A1104 being one suggestion.

Councillors were impressed with the new footpaths on Strubby Road, despite the road being closed for three weeks, but disappointed that the 30mph speed limit signs have not been extended towards Strubby yet, something that was agreed in April and expected to be implemented months ago.

Councillor David Whitehouse reported that there were no applications for small educational grants this year from the **Anne Bolle's charity**.

The history of this small charity is that in 1705 Mrs Anne Bolle 'gave and devised a farm' to pay for a school master to teach poor children their catechism. The school house was still in good repair in 1837, but has since been demolished. It stood near the present farm house of School Farm. The Parish Council is able to give grants to local children from the interest accrued on the balance in the account each year.
