Spring Forward

This spring when the land had dried up enough we were out with the drill to start planting seed in the soil. The soil was still wet underneath, we were having to dig the rear roller out every other turn! This you might think would be good because it meant the seed was going into moisture, well that's what we thought but after we drilled the barley the weather turned dry, cold and windy. Some of the seed grew but some seed just sat in the soil and didn't grow for 6 weeks till a couple of days of rain and some warmth from the sun made the remaining seed chit and grow. This now looks like two crops in one field! This has been the 4th year out of 5 that we've had a dry Spring (Global Warming?). All this impacts on grain prices and is something we as farmers can do nothing about.

One of the fields of Oil Seed Rape was decimated by pigeons

over the winter but has recently recovered. The yield will have been affected but there will be something to harvest. In the wheats and some of the winter barley there are problems with a weed called Blackgrass which used to be controlled with a chemical spray that actually worked, this chemical has now been removed from use by the government and as a result it is becoming difficult to grow these crops and of course the knock on effect is lower yields and therefore prices increase. I know this sounds like a lot of moaning but food prices are going up with everything that is happening in the world and we as farmers cannot do anything about the weather, government legislation, crop pests or world events. Crop yields are less than nearly 40 years ago. In 1984 we averaged 4.2 tons/acre of wheat and now we are lucky to get 3.7 tons/acre and this applies to other crops too. On the cattle side of the farm there are also challenges. The rise in prices of wheat, barley, oats etc. has had a major impact on feed prices for finishing cattle. Pressure from the green lobby to reduce cattle numbers and the rise in vegetarianism/veganism is all contributing to reduced production. In Ireland a survey of farmers has found that 50% of cattle farmers are planning to reduce numbers and I think that this applies also to the rest of the UK. All of these problems in farming will impact on food prices going forward

On a different note please check your security, we have had 2 break-ins on the farm recently, the first time a lock was smashed and removed, they took hand power tools. A few days later they returned and despite the fact that the forklift was blocking the doorway they stole our quad bike! THEY HAD CUT A HOLE IN THE DOOR TO GET IN!
