

INTRODUCTION



We are now moving into the height of our summer season and will see a rise in visitors to the Coast who we want to welcome and ensure that Lincolnshire is the safest place to live, work and visit.

This month has seen the launch of Operation California which relates drink and drug related offences in and around licensed premises. We work with our partners in licensing and East Lindsey District Council to provide reassurance and deal with any offences robustly. During the first two deployments of the itemiser machine, which tests for drug use, we received great feedback from the community. The majority were pleased to see us out and about and engaging with members of the public.

We have received some great feedback from the community in relation to our team and the good work they are doing. We were informed of an issue in Alford and due to the swift work of the team, offenders were dealt with and the incidents have ceased.

Our previous priorities were:

Skegness and surrounding areas:

Speeding on Drummond Road – the Neighbourhood Policing Team have been out with the speed radar gun which has resulted in several vehicles being stopped. Drivers have been educated in relation to the dangers of speeding. Officers have engaged with the community and have received positive feedback in relation to the initiative. The fatal 4 offences (speeding, drink/drug driving, driving without a seatbelt and driving whilst using a mobile phone) will always be a priority for the team as it is for Lincolnshire Police as a whole. It is always a concern for the communities we serve, and we will always do our best to proactively tackle these issues.

Shoplifting at stores on Drummond Road – a site survey has been conducted by our Crime Prevention Officer which has seen feedback given to stores around the best ways to safeguard their high value items. We have attended on several occasions in order to encourage staff to report offences. We have provided a visible presence and offered reassurance.

Youth Anti-Social Behaviour – officers have been patrolling the areas with the most reported youth ASB and will continue to do so as we head into the summer holidays. We are dealing robustly with any identified offenders and using powers to deal with them in an appropriate way. We do try not to criminalise young people but offer education and diversion from the criminal justice system.

Mablethorpe & surrounding areas:

Daytime drinking and related anti-social behaviour in Ingoldmells – this is included in our plans for Operation California and we will be frequently engaging with licensees and patrons. We want to ensure that every is able to visit the area, enjoy themselves and stay safe.


Damage to the beach huts, Sutton on Sea – officers have conducted patrols in the area and we will continue this over the coming weeks and months.

Fatal 4 driving offences – this will be across the area and remains a priority for our Neighbourhood Policing Team – officers have been stopping vehicle and issuing traffic offence reports and educating drivers. We have recently see the introduction of our Roads Policing Unit which is dedicated to road safety and patrolling the County to promote safer driving whilst also dealing robustly with offence revealed.


OUR PRIORITIES

This quarters priorities will be as follows: Wainfleet & Burgh Le Marsh – Fatal Four traffic offences – driving without a seatbelt, drink/drug driving, speeding & driving whilst using a mobile 'phone. Whilst this is also a force priority and always high on the agenda, we will be concentrating on this through the summer in this area. Alford – Youth Anti-Social Behaviour in open spaces – we will look to engage with young persons and help them understand the impact their behaviour can have on the wider community. Skegness - Youth Anti-Social Behaviour - as above. We have seen a number of incidents of ASB and are working with partners to identify offenders and deal with them accordingly. I would encourage anyone to report incidents when they occur. Mablethorpe & Sutton on Sea - criminal damage Ingoldmells – Alcohol related anti-social behaviour. 







