# Saltfleet to Gibraltar Point Beach Management 2022

We have had another successful year and the annual beach nourishment work is complete for 2022.

We have used 400.000cm<sub>3</sub> of sand to renourish the beaches at Mablethorpe Trusthorpe, Boygrift, Huttoft, Wolla Bank, Chapel Six Marshes, Trunch Lane, and Ingoldmells. At Sutton on Sea, there was enough existing sand for us to recycle and move into place.

Van Oord has been nourishing the beautiful sandy Lincolnshire beaches since 2015 on behalf of the Environment Agency.



We will continue to provide technical advice to the Agency Environment in relation implementation of their new flood risk management strategy for defending this coastline.

In the coming months the Environment Agency is planning to carry out routine maintenance and will continue with their investigation and survey work along the coastline to inform their long-term strategy. The Environment Agency will keep you informed as the details of these works are developed.

#### **Considerate Constructor Award**
