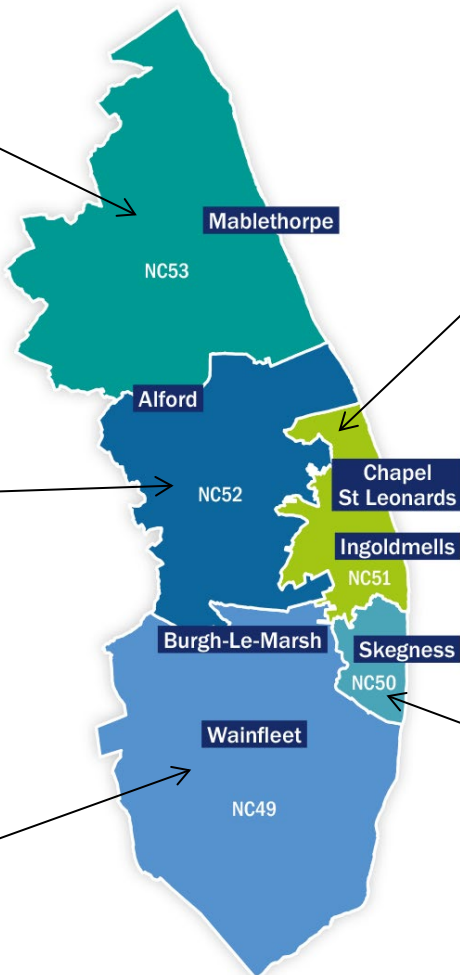

OUR PRIORITIES



Previous Priorities

Part of our previous priorities were youths causing anti-social behaviour (ASB) in a number of locations. The Skegness Neighbourhood Policing Team has issued several Unacceptable Behaviour Warning Letters (UBWL's) and have continued to work with ELDC ASB officers to continue with these efforts.

There have been a number of deployments with the speed radar device which has seen a number of motorists spoken to and education provided in relation to the dangers of speeding.

We have seen a decline in the number of reports in relation to anti-social behaviour in targeted areas.

Current Priorities

A priority setting meeting was held on 9th January 2023 with police and partners. Also taken into account was feedback from the community, the district council together with data from police systems.

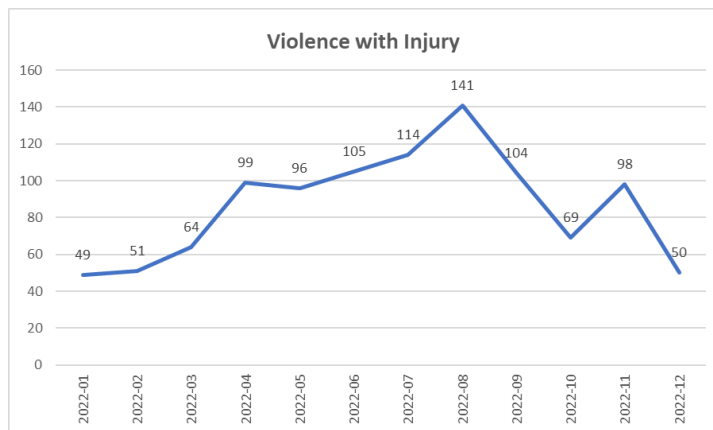
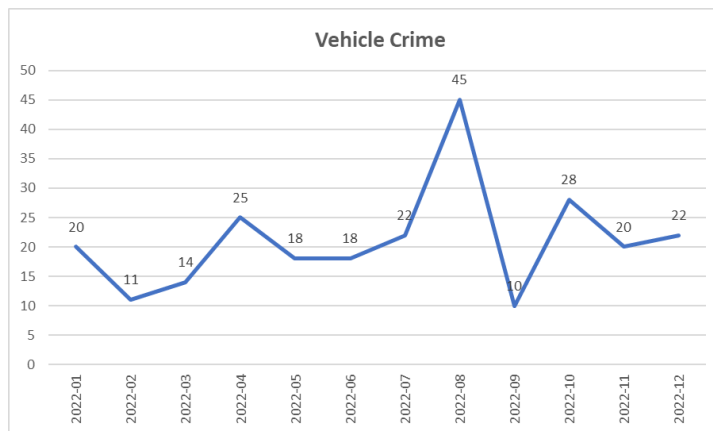
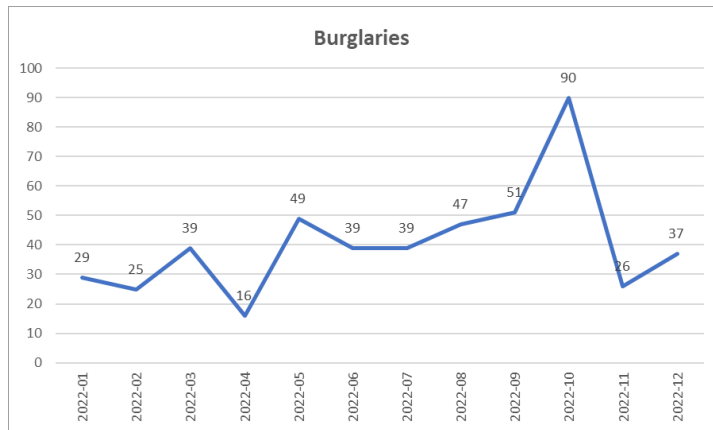
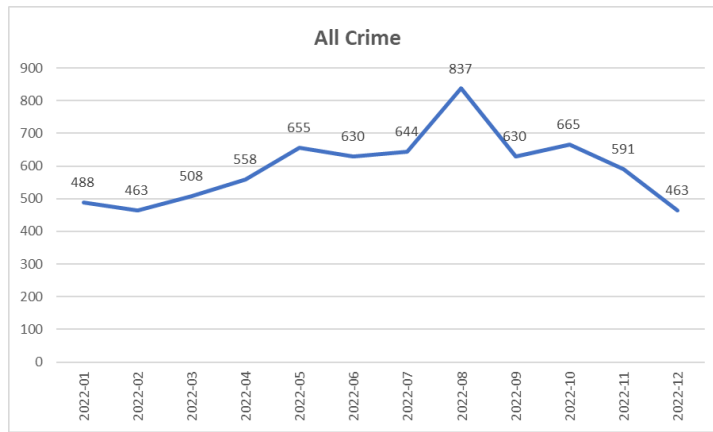
Wainfleet & Burgh Le Marsh – Fatal Four traffic offences – driving without a seatbelt, drink/drug driving, speeding & driving whilst using a mobile 'phone. This is also a force priority and always high on the agenda. This quarter, we will look to focus on The High Street and surrounding areas

Skegness – Off road bikes – We have seen a number of incidents of people riding off road bikes in the Skegness area and these are being driven carelessly and sometimes dangerously. We will be working with partners to identify offenders and deal with them accordingly. I would encourage anyone to report incidents when they occur.

Mablethorpe & Sutton on Sea – Criminal damage to beach huts and youth ASB – working together with partners to promote security and prevent offences. This continues to be a priority for the next quarter.

Ingoldmells & Chapel St Leonards – caravan burglaries – we see an increase of burglaries following people's departure for the season. I would advise and encourage owners to take their valuables with them, including items such as TV's. We will be distributing stickers and posters to be put on display and will work with caravan park watch. This will continue to be a priority.

Alford - We will be concentrating on targeting fatal 4 road traffic offences in the area of Willoughby, Alford. driving without a seatbelt, drink/drug driving, speeding & driving whilst using a mobile 'phone. This is also a force priority and always high on the agenda.

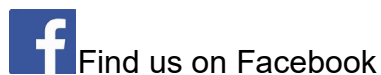
